BACKGROUND

Power Information Technology Company (PITC) being the part of the system and technology provider for all the DISCOs for multiple ICT solutions will be an enabler of the solution in order to ensure the uniformity and smooth transfer of technology to each end user i.e. DISCO.

Power Information Technology Company (PITC) is providing following services / solutions to DISCOs involving TELCOs as key stakeholders;

1. **AMI Landscape:** PITC is providing platform to all Power Sector Companies of Pakistan for conversion of static meters to AMI landscape. PITC already installed AMI system through a local firm, comprising manufacturing, supply and installation of more than 11,400 Nos. GSM/GPRS enabled HT Type, AMR Energy Meters to mitigate the power crisis in Pakistan. USAID funded the project under its Power Distribution Program (PDP) and named it as Load Data Improvement Project (LDIP). The meters were installed on all 11kV Incoming and Outgoing feeders of more than 800 Grid Stations all around Pakistan, including Small Power Producers (SPP)/ Captive Power Producers (CPP), Small Hydel Power Stations (SHPS), B-4 & C-3 Consumer Grids. The meters installed at Incoming side of DISCO grids, SPP, CPP, SHPS, B-4 & C-3 consumer grids communicate load data on near real time basis and the meters installed on Outgoing side communicate load data after every 15 minutes interval. Simultaneously, on/ off status of the 11KV feeders with time is also being monitored/ indicated. Moreover, Meter Data Collection (MDC) software collects the metering data and makes it available to National Power Control Center (NPCC) and different utility (DISCOs) Power Dispatch Centers (PDCs).
2. Ministry of Energy (Power Division) Government of Pakistan has approved policy for transitioning from static energy meters to AMI meters, a strategic approach to mitigate energy theft. PITC role is to provide AMI services to all DISCOs including the Data SIMS / eSIM.
3. PITC has established a state of the art call centre to provide 24/7 customer care services to over 30 million consumers. The call centre is connected to TELCOs via SMPP services to provide update information about their complaints.
4. PITC is using Bulk SMS services from all TELCOs to broadcast load shedding and other power related campaign messages.

PROJECT INTRODUCTION

PITC intends to hire following services for all DISCOs.

1. M2M Services
2. Bulk SMS Services
3. SMS Connectivity over SMPP

SECTION-I: INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. *Name of the Purchaser.*

3. *Cancellation of Contract*

The contract between the parties is subject to cancellation due to any of reason mentioned hereunder:

- a) Submission of false particulars or fake documents.
- b) Any deviations from conditions of the contract.
- c) Refusal by the Contractor to execute the job as per scope / quoted rates.
- d) Manipulation of rates by cartelization shall be viewed very seriously by the Purchaser. If such a situation comes to the notice of the Purchaser and/or there are reasons/ circumstances for the Purchaser to believe so, the concerned Contractor will be called in to give justification of proposal/rates quoted by them. In case PITC is not satisfied with the justification of the firm regarding their quoted rates/ proposal, their appointment is liable to be cancelled.
- e) Any other reason deemed fit by the Purchaser for cancellation.

Such Contractor, whose appointment is cancelled due to any of the above reasons, will not be considered for subsequent assignments for a period of three years.

4. *Subcontracting*

The Contractor is not permitted to sub-contract any part of its obligations under the Contract with PITC.

5. *Intellectual Property*

PITC, shall own and have a right in perpetuity to use all newly created Intellectual Property Rights which have been developed solely during execution of the Contract that will be awarded further by PITC, including but not limited to all templates, reports, designs, records, application configurations, data and written material, products, specifications and drawings, source code and object code and other documents which have been newly created and developed by the Contractor solely during the performance of Related Services and for the purposes of *inter-alia* use or sub-license of such Services under this Contract. The Contractor should undertake to disclose all such Intellectual Property Rights arising in performance of the Related Services to the Purchaser and execute all such agreements/documents and file all relevant applications, effect transfers and obtain all permits and approvals at its sole cost that may be necessary in this regard to effectively transfer and conserve the Intellectual Property Rights of the Purchaser. To the extent that Intellectual Property Rights are unable by law to so vest, the Contractor undertakes to assigns those Intellectual Property Rights to Purchaser on creation.

The Contractor shall undertake to ensure that all approvals, registrations, licenses, permits and rights etc. which are inter-alia necessary for use of the goods supplied / service provided by the Contractor, the same shall be acquired in the name of the Purchaser, and the same may be assigned by the Purchaser to the Contractor solely for the purpose of execution of any of its obligations under the terms of the Contract. However, subsequent to the terms of the Contract, such approvals,

registrations, licenses, permits and rights etc. shall endure to the exclusive benefit of the Purchaser. The Contractor shall ensure that while he uses any software, hardware, processes, document or material in the course of performing the Services, he does not infringe the Intellectual Property Rights of any person and the Contractor shall keep the Purchaser indemnified against all costs, expenses and liabilities howsoever, arising out of any illegal or unauthorized use (piracy) or in connection with any claim or proceedings relating to any breach or violation of any permission/license terms or infringement of any Intellectual Property Rights by the Contractor or its personnel or personnel of any of its JV/consortium members during the course of performance of the Related Services. In case of any infringement by the Contractor, the Contractor shall have sole control of the defense and all related settlement negotiations.

Subject to above sub-clauses on intellectual property, the Contractor shall retain exclusive ownership of all methods, concepts, algorithms, trade secrets, software documentation, other intellectual property or other information belonging to the Contractor that existed before the effective date of the Contract.

6. Area of Work

The Contractor shall be required to work in PITC WAPDA House, Lahore and across the country for provisioning of telecommunication services as per following detail.

TELCOs Communication Services (Data / Text)

LOT-A: M2M Services
LOT-B: Bulk SMS Services
LOT-C: SMS Connectivity over SMPP

7. Confidentiality

The Contractor/Consortium and the personnel of any of them shall not disclose the terms, conditions or any information related to the project unless approved by Company. This Condition is applicable for five (5) years after the completion of entire Project.

8. Bid Security / Earnest Money Deposit (EMD)

The bidder will submit amount **Rs 200,000 bid security** per LOT in shape of Bank Guarantee/Demand Draft, valid for 90 days from the date of submission of bid issued in favor of Chief Executive Officer PITC, WAPDA House, Lahore. The bid security issued by any scheduled bank of Pakistan having AA+ rating will be acceptable. Cheques will not be acceptable in any case.

Within (15) days of the receipt of notification of award from the Purchaser, the successful Bidder shall furnish the Performance Security in accordance with the Performance Security Form GCC clause 23 using form included in Section VIII). The value of Performance Security shall be 10% of the work order value to be issued by any scheduled bank of Pakistan having “AA+” rating. The Performance Security will be valid till the completion of the assignment or any such extended period as decided by the Purchaser.

Bid Security and Performance Guarantee shall be furnished on non-judicial stamp paper of the value prescribed by the Government.

9. Bid Validity Period

Bid should be valid for a period as specified in the Data Sheet from the date of opening of financial proposal.

10. Acceptable Banks

All bank related documents shall be submitted only from scheduled banks of Pakistan having “AA+” rating.

11. Escalation of Prices

The quoted prices will be firm and final and will not be escalated for any reason what so ever.

12. Bid Submission

The complete offer should be submitted as under:-

- a) The original and all copy of the Bid shall be clear & typed (without cutting) in indelible ink and shall be signed by the Bidder or a duly authorized person. The authorisation (Power of Attorney) shall be provided in writing and must be an integral part of the Bid. All pages of the Bid shall be initialled by the person or persons signing the Bid.
- b) The Bid shall contain no interlineations, erasures or over-writing except as necessary to correct errors made by the Bidder, in which case such corrections shall be initialled by the person or persons signing the Bid.
- c) **the bidder can participate in any one or all LOTS,**
- d) Non-submission of the required information/data shall render the offer liable for rejection.
- e) Alternate bid shall not be accepted

13. Acceptance / Rejection

PITC reserves the right to accept or reject any or all of the bids or a part thereof at any stage without any liability.

14. Formulation of Cartel or Collusion

If formulation of Cartel or Collusion is observed in any of the bid/s, action will be taken against the relevant bidder/s which may tend to black listing and any other action /remedies available under law.

15. Payment Clause for all LOTs:

Payment will be made directly by consignees on quarterly basis within thirty days, from the date of receipt of invoice, on production of following documents

- a) Invoice in triplicate having NTN.
- b) Service Satisfactory Report.
- c) Sales Tax Invoice (if not exempted) or attach exemption certificate.
- d) Non-payment certificate.
- e) Performance Security Receipt Certificate (otherwise performance security will be deducted from the submitted invoice).

The payment of GST fixed by the Government will be made to the Contractor on production of original GST return cum payment Challans and sales summary or any other documents as required under the Sales Tax Act 1990 as amended till date.

16. Late Bid

The Purchaser shall not consider any bid that arrives after the dead line for submission of bid. Any bid received by the purchaser after the dead line for submission of bid shall be declared late, rejected and returned unopened to the bidder.

17. Modification of Bids

- a) The Bidder may modify or withdraw his Bid after the submission of Bid, provided that written notice of the modification or withdrawal is received by the Purchaser prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of Bids.
- b) No Bid shall be withdrawn, substituted, or modified in the interval between the deadline for submission of bids and the expiration of the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder

18. Amendment of Bid Schedule

- i) At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Bids, the purchaser may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder, modify the Bid Schedule/Bidding Documents by amendment.

- ii) The amendment will be notified in writing or by Fax, email or courier to all prospective Bidders who have received the Bid Schedule/Bidding Documents and will be binding on them.

19. Sealing and Marking of Bids

- i. The Bidder shall seal the original and each copy of the bid in an inner and an outer envelope, duly marking the envelopes as "Original" or "Copy".
- ii. The inner and outer envelopes shall be:-
 - a) Addressed to the purchaser at the following address:-
“Director General ISDS, PITC, 402-WAPDA House Lahore”.
 - b) Bear the nomenclature of the services, the Request for Proposal (RFP) number, and the words "**DO NOT OPEN BEFORE 11:30 A.M on 22-07-2024.**"
 - c) In addition to above, the inner envelope shall indicate the name and address of the Bidder to enable the bid to be returned unopened in case it is declared "Late".
- iii. If the outer envelope is not sealed and marked as required, by the purchaser, purchaser shall not be responsible for the bid's misplacement.

20. Delivery Schedule

Schedule of Contractor will start from the date of award of Contract and initially will be for **two (02) years** and may be extended on mutual consent on satisfactory performance.

21. Technical and Financial Scoring

If the Bidder does not accept the score evaluated by evaluation committee, its Bid shall be rejected, and its bid security shall be forfeited.

22. List of Documents to be submitted with the bid

- i. Technical Proposal (sealed in envelop marked as **technical proposal**) duly supported by all the relevant documents / experience certificates supported by copies of contract Agreement successfully completed, End-user certificates, on the prescribed formats as attached in this RFP in Section IX under heading “Bidder Response Form” from F-1 to F-6.
- ii. Bid Security along with original deposit receipt issued against the purchase of bidding documents.
- iii. Authorization letter issued by the bidder in favor of person participating in the tender opening process and authorized for making further correspondence with the purchaser, attesting three specimen signatures of the authorized person with Computerized National Identity Card (CNIC) No. along with a copy of CNIC. This authorization shall be issued on letter head of the bidder/ JV.
- iv. Each page of the bidding document is to be signed and stamped by the bidder or his authorize representative.

23. Delivery Period:

The services will be started immediately after award of contract.

24. Forfeiture of Security Bond / Bank Guarantee / Performance Bond

PITC has the right to forfeit the Security Bond / Bank Guarantee /Performance Bond:-

- i. If the Contractor:-
 - a) Fails to provide the services within the time specified.
 - b) Commits any breach of Contract.
- ii. For other reasons specified in the Contract by the contracting officer for forfeiting the security deposit.

If the forfeiture of the security deposit does not compensate the contracting officer of Purchaser for losses suffered due to non-delivery or breach of Contract or for any other reasons, the contracting officer of purchaser shall have a right to forfeit other security deposits or to recover the same from any other security deposit made in favor of any OTHER DISCO/GENCO/NTDC/DISCO/PITC/GENCO Holding or from any claim due to the Contractor from any other DISCO/GENCO/NTDC/DISCO/PITC/GENCO Holding.

25. Disclosure Clause

The Contractor hereby declares that it has not obtained or induced the procurement of any contract, right, interest, privilege or other obligation or benefit from Government of Pakistan or any administrative sub division or agency thereof or any other entity owned or controlled by it (GOP) through any corrupt business practice.

Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Contractor represents and warrants that it has fully declared the brokerage, commission, fees, etc. paid or payable to anyone and not given or agreed to give and shall not give or agree to give to anyone within or outside Pakistan either directly or indirectly through any natural or juridical person, including its affiliate, agent, associate, broker, Contractor, director, promoter, shareholder, sponsor or subsidiary, any commission, gratification, bribe, finder’s fee or kickback, whether described as consultation fee or otherwise, with the object of obtaining or including the procurement of a contract, right, interest, privilege or other obligation or benefit in whatsoever from GOP, except that which has been expressly declared pursuant hereto.

The Contractor certifies that it has made and will make full disclosure of all agreements and arrangements with all persons in respect of or related to the transaction with GOP and has not taken any action or will not take any action to circumvent the above declaration, representation or warranty.

The Contractor accepts full responsibility and strict liability for making any false declaration, no making full disclosure, misrepresenting facts or taking any action likely to defeat the purpose of this declaration, representation and warranty. It agrees that any contract, right, interest, privilege or other obligation or benefit obtained or procured as aforesaid shall, without prejudice to any other right and remedies available to GOP under any law contract or other instrument, be voidable at the option of GOP.

Notwithstanding any right and remedies exercised by GOP in this regard, the Contractor agrees to indemnify GOP for any loss or damage incurred by it on account of its corrupt business practices and further pay compensation to GOP in an amount equivalent to ten time the sum of any commission, gratification, bribe, finder’s fee or kickback given by the Contractor as aforesaid for the purpose of obtaining or inducing the procurement of any contract, right, interest, privilege or other obligation or benefit in whatsoever form from GOP. Please acknowledge receipt in token of acceptance at the earliest, but not later than 15 days from the date of purchase order.

SECTION-IV: Lot- A M2M Services

1. Objectives

PITC intends to hire the services of Cellular Data Service Providers to provide M2M 4G/2G multi- roaming SIM Cards for AMI Project to Facilitate Communication Between Data Concentrator Units (DCUs)/Meters and Head End System (HES) for Metering Data Transmission over Wide Area Network(WAN) link to PITC. The M2M services coverage area will be whole Pakistan. The already provided M2M data SIMs will also be governed under this RFP.

2. Scope of Services and Deliverables

The Service Provider should adhere to the following requirements for the purchase of M2M multi- network SIM Cards of Industrial Grade. Multi Network here defines that the SIM card shall support switching between 4G/3G/ and 2G as per availability and signal strength. Anytime the preferred network (4G) comes back available, the device will be connected to the preferred network.

The Procurement of SIM cards is divided into two LOTs and the Service Provider shall select the LOT based on its Coverage Map.

I. Network Performance, Availability and Compatibility

The selected mobile Service Provider Network must:

- Support the 2G /3G and/or 4G technologies.
- Support all PTA Approved 4G/3G/2G bands,
- Support Re-Connection behavior after detecting an unexpected, interrupted Communication session.
- Support Data Push functionality.

II. Coverage and Roaming

- The selected mobile SIM Service Provider will be responsible for offering extensive and reliable mobile network coverage and ensuring seamless connectivity for data services.
- In case weak signal areas are identified by the Client during the deployment, then the service provider shall take every measure to improve coverage in the regions.
- The Service Provider should possess the capacity to handle increasing subscriber demands and network traffic.
- The Service Provider should maintain a high level of service quality and ensure minimal data interruptions, network downtime, and implement an efficient network monitoring system to identify and resolve any network-related issues promptly.

III. Data plans and Billing

- The mobile network Service Provider is required to provide a data plan as per BoQ.
- Changes to the data plans will be made in consultation between the Service Provider and Client, with a mutual understanding.
- The Service Provider shall ensure that the billing process shall be accurate and free from errors.
- Invoice shall be generated and delivered through both Dashboard and Courier monthly. Any billing discrepancies reported by PITC shall be addressed and resolved within 5 working days from the date of notification.
- The invoice shall provide a detailed breakdown of charges, including but not limited to, usage charges, taxes, and any other applicable fees. Moreover, no hidden charges will be paid if not disclosed earlier.
- Each Monthly Invoice shall show the following but not limited to cost breakdown,

IV. Security

- The network must meet the highest international standards of privacy and security for the SmartMeter and other sensitive data.
- Network shall support IMEI Lock to ensure the security and support changeable APN/Password.

V. Scalability and Flexibility

- The Service Provider should commit to continuously expand its network infrastructure, including the deployment of new base stations, towers, and fiber-optic cables, to accommodate the increasing demand for data services to maintain PITC QoS.
- The Service Provider shall proactively upgrade its network bandwidth and capacity to handle growing data traffic, ensuring smooth data transmission even during peak

 - Down Since 6 Hours
 - Down Since 12 Hours
 - Down Since 23 Hours
 - Ever Down (Not communicated from last 24 hours or more)
- Live Dashboard should indicate the last communication time between the Service Provider and each SIM Card.
 - Data Throughput (desirable).
 - Network QoS performance level indicator/area.
 - Live Map View including Network visibility of each link involved showing UP and DOWN links with historical data of UP/DOWN time.
 - The Complaint Management System should be part of the dashboard with a resolution time status bar.
 - The Live Dashboard should have capabilities of activation, deactivation, and modification of SIM cards.
 - Provide security awareness training to PITC staff and personnel dealing with PITC SIM Dashboard.
 - Dynamic resource allocation (Selection between Two packages, however the Service provider shall provide the SIMs with Pre-configured packages as per SOR).

VIII. Physical Features of M2M SIM Card & Lifecycle

- The SIM card size should be compatible with smart meters and DCU jackets.
- Industrial standard M2M-2FF SIM cards with tolerance to a large range of operating temperature, humidity, vibration, and resistance which are indicated by specific ratings (e.g., IP67 or IP68).
- Providing 15-20 years of operational life of SIM cards.
- Service Providers will manage the end-of-life process of the SIM cards, adhering to environmental regulations and best practices for e-waste disposal.
- The physical structure of these SIM cards is designed to have a lifespan that aligns with the expected operational life of the smart meters.
- SIM cards used in smart meters for the AMI project are made from durable materials, typically plastic or composite, to withstand the conditions of their deployment environment, such as temperature variations and exposure to dust and humidity.
- The Service Provider guarantees that the provided SIM cards are designed and

manufactured to withstand normal wear and tear, ensuring durability throughout their expected lifetime.

IX. Certification and Compliance

- Service Providers must ensure that the SIMs and Services they offer are approved by the PTA and comply with technical standards set by PTA.
- To tackle cybercrimes and ensure cybersecurity (PTA S. R. 0. 1226(I)/2020), Service Providers should agree to cooperate with the NR3C, Pakistan's cybercrime investigation agency.
- The Service Provider shall comply with PTA regulations for services, cybersecurity and cybercrime prevention, customer protection and complaint resolution.

 - 3GPP TS 31.101 version 17.1.0 Release 17(Related to interface between the UICC and the Terminal for 3GPP telecom network operation including physical characteristics, electrical interface, transport protocols, communication commands and procedures, logical structure of UICC, and application independent files and protocols).

XIII. Assurance of Quality-of-Service Standards

24/7 Support Service should be available. The Service Provider will respond promptly to PITC queries, complaints, and service requests. The response time for customer support inquiries will not exceed 1 hour during normal business hours.

3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- a. All the M2M SIM Cards must be brand new, original, and not refurbished.
- b. All the M2M SIM Cards along with protection jackets will be provided by the vendor in separate packaging of Package No. 1 & Package No. 2 and a complete list of all such items along with unit cost shall be listed.
- c. Vendor will provide all the detailed technical and configuration manuals at the time of hand over.
- d. Vendors will be liable to do any additional tasks related to SIM Cards as per PITC requirement if found necessary/unavoidable.
- e. Vendor must provide the valid Partnership certificate from Principal & MAF (Manufacturer Authorization Form).
- f. Prompt replacement of burnt / non-functioning equipment will be the responsibility of the service provider.
- g. Each Provided SIM card shall be pre-Activated (Mapped ICCID to MSISDN).

4. ELIGIBILITY

The Bidder should have exclusive support infrastructure for maintenance of items proposed to supply by the Bidder on locations as stated above and be able to provide & maintain Hardware and Services with their competent support engineers.

SECTION-V: Lot- B Bulk-SMS Services

I. SCOPE OF WORK

The SMS gateway/service-providing agency (Telecom Operators Only) will provide the facility to send transactional SMS to register / non registered mobiles of customers of DISCOs with accuracy. The agency should provide software to facilitate multiple text formats for messages sent to customers of DISCOs and their internal staff. The service provider will format the SMS templates and coordinate with PITC for approval of new messages or changes in messages as per PITC requirement. The agency will maintain total SMS delivery report with proper acknowledgement. Presently, PITC is serving about 24 million customers and all DISCOs customers are expected to be covered under this campaign message in phases.

Process Detail:

- i. Bulk SMS to all mobile numbers across the country irrespective of mobile operator.
- ii. Bidder's capability to mask outgoing SMS from PITC to Customer.
- iii. The bidder will maintain database of registered customer's mobile number, customer id, etc.
- iv. SMS software will be integrated with PITC data server for fetching Customer meter reading, Billing information, Payment, load shedding, maintenance schedule etc. in routine and will send this information to Customer.
- v. Customer will be able to receive SMS message to know information regarding meter reading, billing date, payment confirmation and same shall be replied by the system of bidder

- vi. PITC may send Bulk SMS from time to time to customers and general public for marketing, awareness and announcement purposes.

The following items are included as part of scope of work for implementation of solution.

A. SMS Messaging Services

i. PITC’s Short Code:

The vendor will have to configure with operators already acquired short code of PITC (PITC’s ownership) so that customers can send SMS to PITC through any of the mobile phone companies operating in Pakistan.

The bidder should mention registration / transactional SMS charges to be charged from end user DISCOs (customers) as it has weightage for evaluation.

ii. Bulk SMS:

PITC will send Bulk SMS from time to time to the customers and general public for marketing, awareness and announcement purposes. These messages will be of general nature and may or may not contain customer specific data. List of mobile numbers will be governed by a certain selection criteria to be decided by PITC from time to time.

iii. SMS Alerts i.e. Transactional SMS Sent:

Following customer-specific SMS alerts will be sent to customers automatically using specific SMS templates:

- a) Complaint Registration & replies
- b) Meter Reading
- c) Billing
- d) Disconnection Notice
- e) Payment Acknowledgement
- f) Load-shedding Schedule
- g) Shutdown Schedule
- h) Etc.

B. PITC expects the service provider to handle three different types of SMSs:

Message Type	Description
Bulk SMS	The SMS text sent to a list of mobile numbers
Transactional SMS Sent	SMS text to registered / non-registered mobile numbers with customer specific data. However, the specific text of the message is based upon a template and certain fields will be replaced with variable data.

NOTE: Text message is expected to be limited within range of 200 characters. However bidder needs to mention in the bid the message charging criteria, if the text length exceeds the limit of 200 characters.

C. Integration with PITC Applications:

The bidder will be required to integrate its SMS gateway/system, with PITC exists or any new applications during the contract period.

D. Customer Database & Other Data

The Customer Database and all Other Data sent via SMS shall be the property of PITC. The Service Provider cannot use the information for any purpose other than specifically authorized by PITC. The bidder will have to sign a Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA) to that effect. Any breach of this

confidential information or misuse of this information (for example unauthorized SMS messages being sent) shall be cause for immediate contract termination and other punitive action, which PITC may choose to take.

E. Expected Service Volumes

The following are the Expected Service Volumes:

Data of mobile phone numbers along with reference numbers will be required to send SMS to customers. Bulk SMS will be sent to all mobile phones across the country for registration of customers. Therefore monthly volume of bulk SMS sent will depend upon the data received through SMS and by other means. PITC may stop this awareness campaign/data gathering exercise at any stage, the authority decides that enough data has been gathered.

Transactional SMS will be sent to all registered customers at least once a month.

F. Other Responsibilities

It is bidder’s responsibility to get all types of clearances, license requirements from Government and all the concerned regulators for smooth & hassle free functioning of SMS services.

It is bidder’s responsibility to complete all the statutory / regulatory compliance and any liaising requirements.

G. Technical Requirements

i. SMS Gateway APIs (Application Program Interfaces)

The APIs provided by the SMS Gateway will be used by multiple applications within PITC. The SMS Gateway APIs must have below mentioned functionalities:

- a. Minimum Throughput of 500 SMS/sec to prevent SMS queue formation at PITC
- b. Full support for HTTP, HTTPS, FTP, SMPP, and Bulk SMS.
- c. Provision for binding IP address to restrict the SMS sending host machines.
- d. Support for short code number or Sender IDs defined by PITC.
- e. Support for the creation and use of unlimited number of user defined SMS templates.
- f. Unicode character support for sending SMS in multiple PITC.
- g. Group SMS Facility.
- h. Provision for SMS wise and Number wise Scheduling/Rescheduling in working and non-working days.
- i. Delivery of long SMS (exceeding 160 characters) as single SMS on receiver’s handset.

ii. SMS Gateway Web GUI (Graphical User Interface)

- a. It should be secured via SSL and user id/password based access control and open on all popular browsers (i.e. Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, Opera, Safari, Firefox, and Netscape etc.).
- b. Ability to create and manage groups. Further, it must be possible to send SMS to individual numbers or groups directly without entering the individual numbers again.
- c. Multiple upload formats like CSV, Excel and XML for uploading list of mobile numbers along with plug-in for sending SMS.
- d. Creation and use of unlimited number of user defined SMS templates.
- e. Provision for cancellation of SMS queue.
- f. Provision for SMS wise and Number wise Scheduling/Rescheduling in working and non-working days.

- iii. **Delivery Receipt/Report/Acknowledge and Audit trail**
 - a. SMS gateway should send back a Delivery Receipt/Report/Acknowledge after delivery via Web/Email/SMS.
 - b. SMS gateway should also provide audit trail via Web/Email/SMS for the SMS sent.
- iv. **MIS (Management Information Systems) Reports**

SECTION-V: Lot- C SMS Connectivity over SMPP

Scope of Work

The Short Message Peer-to-Peer (SMPP) is a protocol used by the telecommunications industry for exchanging SMS messages between Short Message Service Centers (SMSC) and/or External Short Messaging Entities (ESME) / Handsets.

PITC requires SMS (Short Messaging Service) over SMPP (Short Message Peer-Peer) to be provided by the bidder to send Transactional SMS to its users. As per the current projections, it is estimated that 1,000,000 SMS/month will be sent. However this requirement is tentative and actual requirements may vary.

1. Technical requirements

- 1.1 Type of connectivity between PITC and SMS Gateway will be via **Internet/VPN** and all network security concerns shall be taken care.
- 1.2 Minimum Throughput of 500 SMS/sec to prevent SMS queue formation at PITC

- 1.3. Support for short code/Long Codes number or Sender IDs defined by PITC.

- 1.6. Group SMS Facility.

1.7. Provision for SMS wise and Number wise Scheduling/Rescheduling in working and non-working days.

1.8. Delivery of long SMS (exceeding 160 characters) as single SMS on receiver's handset.

4. Delivery Receipt/Report/Acknowledge and Audit trail

3.1. SMS gateway should send back a Delivery Receipt/Report/Acknowledge after delivery via Web/Email/SMS.

3.2. SMS gateway should also provide audit trail via Web/Email/SMS for the SMS sent.

5. MIS (Management Information Systems) Reports

d) All SMS messages are to be delivered to the recipients within 10 seconds of receipt of the message at provider's server and expected to be delivered to the mobile subscriber within 30 seconds.

SECTION – V BID EVALUATION METHODOLOGY

The following is the Bid process / evaluation methodology that will be adapted by Utilities for appointment of Contractor.

a. RFPs will be given to all applicants /participants.

b. Single Stage – Single Envelope Procedure:-

i. The bid shall comprise a single package containing two separate envelopes. Each envelope shall contain separately the financial proposal and the technical proposal;

ii. the envelopes shall be marked as "FINANCIAL PROPOSAL" and "TECHNICAL PROPOSAL" in bold and legible letters to avoid confusion;

iii. Both Technical & Financial Bids will be opened on 22-07-2024.

iv. the procuring agency shall evaluate the technical proposal in a manner prescribed in advance, without reference to the price and reject any proposal which does not conform to the specified requirements;

v. during the technical evaluation no amendments in the technical proposal shall be permitted;

vi. the bidder can participate in any one or all LOTS.

- vii. the technically responsive and financially lowest bidder will be awarded the tender.
- c. **Alternate bids** will not be allowed. Alternate technical modules, methodologies, approach, project plan or timelines that deviate from the defined scope will be considered as alternate bid and will be considered as non-responsive.
- d. **Preliminary Evaluation:** The technical proposals will be reviewed for deviations, acceptance of terms and conditions, adherence to scope of work, formats required, purchase of bid document etc., In case of non-compliance on any of the above, bids will be considered as technically non-responsive.
- e. **Evaluation:**
 - i. The total points for technical bid evaluation are 100 out of which the technical bid qualification requires 70 points.
 - ii. Technical bids will be evaluated as per given criteria in clause f below. The bidder will be declared technically qualified if score of technical factors is 70% or more.
 - iii. The contract will be awarded to technically qualified and financially lowest bidder.
